Young man killed in crash

A young Sunshine man was killed when his car and a transport collided on the Hume Highway on Easter Friday.

He was Nickolos Salamon, 21, of 2 Bell St., who was on his way to the Snowy Mountains for the weekend with some friends.

Nickolos, who lives with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. N. Nickolos, came to Australia from Hungary.

He was employed by Deneys of Sun Cres., Sunshine and was in charge of the boys' wear department. He was highly regarded by the firm and a spokesman for Deneys said Nickolos was a promising young executive.

A passenger in the car was Ken Lasslett, 17, of Footscray, who also works for Deneys. He received hand and head injuries.

Ahead of Nickolos's car was Jeffrey Muller, 20, of 7 Corio St., Sunshine. His car was also involved in the collision and his car was a "write off".

Jeffrey had a miraculous escape from injury. His mother and father, Mr. and Mrs. E. Muller, were also on the Hume Highway, on their way to NSW and arrived at the scene of the crash about an hour later.

Mr. Muller is manager of Deneys Sunshine store. He said that Nickolos was a respected and well-liked member of the staff.

After a service at the Holt St. Catholic Church yesterday (Wednesday) the funeral party went to the Western Suburbs Cemetery.
