ANOTHER MAN RUN OVER.

Another fatality occurred near the junction of the Williamstown and Essendon lines some time on Wednesday evening, the body of Richard Delakey, 48 years of years, being discovered about midnight on the Williamstown line by Porter Thomas, of South Kensington station. Thomas was walking towards Melbourne and when about midway between the junction and the North Melbourne station he saw a man lying by the side of the rails. Thinking that he was inchriated and sleeping, Thomas stooped to awaken him, and then discovered that he was dead. Striking a match a fearful sight was disclosed, as the legs and the lower part of the body were dreadfully mangled. The Kensington pelice having been informed of the occurrence, Constable Malone conveyed the body to the Morgue, where it was identified yesterday afternson. Delahey was 48 years of age, a married man, residing with his wife and three children, two of whom are by a forner marriage, at St. Albans, where he carried on business as a farmer and cowkeeper. A few days ago he had a dispute with his wife over money matters, and left his home, though Mrs. Delahey saw him in Footseray at 12.15 p.m. on Wednesday. It is supposed to be a case of suicide.
