EQUIPMENT DESTROYED IN BLAZE

More than \$2000 worth of sporting equipment was lost when a fire broke out in the Sunshine YCW clubrooms at Kinder-Smith Reserve, Braybrook, on Wednesday last week.

The fire destroyed everything in the clubrooms, including five cricket sets valued at \$2000.

Sporting equipment owned by the YCW football and cricket clubs was reduced to ashes in the blaze, which lasted for over an hour.

"The fire has caused a great setback to the YCW club," the publicity officer for the club, Mr. John Larson, told the Advocate this week.

"It will affect us financially," he said.

"We have had to spend out money to get a new coach and now this fire has put us further back."

In order to offset the loss to the club, a barbeque is being held this Saturday evening at the home of Mr. E. Schwartz, at 24 Myanyon St., Sunshine.

The function will start at 7 pm and all are welcome.

"This barbeque will be the first of many functions to raise money," Mr. Larson said.

"We hope to hold as many fund raising functions as possible while sympathy is still there."
