### SECOND FIRE HITS COMPANY

**FIRE** has again destroyed part of the Kagan Brothers Storage complex in Sunshine.

It is the second at the warehouse in three months.

The previous fire caused \$60,000 worth of damage in September.

A fire late on Friday night ripped through the firm's administration block and two storage warehouses in Fourth Ave.

All three buildings were totally destroyed in the blaze.

Three months ago fire destroyed a warehouse and the caretaker's house in Third Ave., immediately behind the buildings which caught fire on Friday.

The fire on Friday broke out at about 10.30 p.m. and took about two hours to control.

### BATTLE

Fifteen fire units and about 45 men battled the blaze. It was not completely extinguished until about 6 a.m. on Saturday.

The warehouses were stored full with foam rubber. Damage caused by Friday's fire has been estimated at about \$250,000.

Police and ambulances were called to the scene but there were no reported injuries.
