An explosion at a powder mill house at Deer Park yesterday considerably damaged the building and injured two men, one badly. Robert Taylor, 56, of Normanby-street. Oakietgh, was taken to the Royal Meloourne Hospital suffering from bad burns on the head, face and hands. He was in a dangerous condition last night. Richard Mitcheley suffered minor injuries and shock. It is believed that black powder exploded in a hut in which Taylor was working, but the actual cause of the explosion is being investigated by the operational safety committee of the Ministry of Munitions.
