SERVICE BUS KILLS POSTMAN ON BALLARAT ROAD.

Edward Horwood, aged 63 years, a contract letter carrier, and a married man with a wife and family, fixing at 20 Pickett street, hootscray, whilst engaged in his ordinary work, on Tuesday, about 10.15 a.m., was knocked down by a heavy service bus on the Ballarat road, near fixing's store, and received such severe head injuries—that he died at Mont Pellier hospital about noon.

The circumstances in which the unfortunate man met his death are the subject of conflicting testimony. He had breyele and was riding it at the time. One account says he had just delivered a letter and was going along the road when the bus, striving to another, smashed into him. It is said that he was in the act of turning into Richelieu street. and had put out his hand when he was struck. The breyele was uninjured, and from this it has been deduced that deceased was walking, but the balance of evidence is the other way.

The daily press seems to have received no information of the occurrence.

The burial took place at Footscray cemetery on Thursday. Much sympathy is expressed with the bereaved wife and family by Maidstone residents whom he had faithfully served for the past two years. A wreath and many flowers laid on the grave testified to their respect.
