Rosamond Bowling Club rooms fire

SUPPORT BY COUNCIL FOR BOWLERS

SUNSHINE COUNCIL has agreed to give the Rosamond Bowling Club in Maidstone strong support following the recent fire which completely destroyed the club's rooms and all its records.

River Ward's Councillor, Jack Tighe, said that council was most sympathetic towards the club on the happening that had occurred and that council would give as much co-operation as possible to the club in the construction of a new clubhouse.

"The Rosamond club, who has prepared sketch plans free of charge, can be assured of strong council support," said Cr. Tighe.

Cr. Ted Coulson said, "These plans appear to be in order and it is estimated that the building would cost about \$30,000."

Cr. Tighe said, "The club would prefer to locate the new building south of the present rinks however this may pose some practical problems in connecting to the existing septic tank which was located originally to serve buildings to the north."

Reporting the matter to council Sunshine's building surveyor, Mr. Noel Heaton, said, "The club has formed a building committee from its members and this committee comprises men who have had long and expert experience in the building trade. One of the members has obtained the services of an architect friend, ever this would need to be confirmed."

On the recommendation of Mr. Heaton, Cr. Tighe successfully moved that sketch plans for the new clubhouse be adopted in principle and that council confirm the architect fees, if any, for the preparation of final drawings at no cost to the club.
