FIRE AT RAILWAY STATION.

A large portion of the new buildings at the Sunshine railway station was destroyed by fire on Saturday morning. Advices received at the head office stated that all the station buildings and about 100ft. of verandah on the up side of the sta-tion were burned. The fire broke out at about 5.30 n.m., and, despite the efforts of the fire brigade, this side of the station was destroyed, together with tickets, parcels, and waybills.

Only recently the station was rebuilt, and the portion destroyed was practically new. The loss is roughly estimated at about £700. No railway buildings are insured, but pro-vision for loss by fire is made by a departmental fund. The cause of the

fire is unknown.

Mr. T. Howell was in charge of the Sunshine fire brigade, and they did good work. The Footscray brigade arrived later with a hose cart and steamer. The conflagration drew a number of onlookers to the scene,
