Two Hurt at Warburton

Mr. Lawrence Chapman, 23 years, Derby-road, Sunshine, and Miss Nellie Gale, 23, Bidley-street, Sunshine, suffered head injuries in a collision between their motor cycle and a car on the Clement Creek-road, about three miles from Warburton, late yesterday afternoon. They were rounding a sharp bend when the mishap occurred. The impact threw them about 30 feet. After first-aid treatment at the Hydro Hospital, Warburton, they were brought by civil ambulance to Melbourne and admitted to Royal Melbourne Hospital. Mr. Chapman sustained a fractured skull and lacerated scalp. Miss Gale concussion and a lacerated scalp.

TWO DEAD IN CYCLE ACCIDENT

4 Week-end Deaths

Two men were killed at 1 a.m. today, when a motor cycle ran head-on into a car in Warrigal Road, near Keys Road, Moonee-

bin. John Paddington, 30, of Bayview Street, Prahran, who was believed to be driving the motor cycle, and Stanley James Watson, 16, an apprentice engineer, Prahran, were also

witnessed.

Two others were killed and ten people injured in road accidents, and another man collapsed at the wheel of his car.

George J. Barnes, 38, retired farmer, of Prahran, was struck by a car as he crossed from a car on to the main road, a short distance from the township gate on Sunday morning.

On Saturday night he had visited GPO with friends to see the manager, Mr. Merrill, about his son, Peter, 20. He died an hour after he was admitted to the Mansfield Hospital.

Rev. Andrew, 37, Church of England Minister, Clinton Street, Richmond, while riding a bicycle, collided with a car in the Brunswick South Yards.

Mr. Freshville Edwards, 33, Petersen Street, Preston, collapsed and died while riding his car to Northcote Hills yesterday night. The car, driven by his wife Gladys, and Annie Edwards, 30, his wife, was admitted to Alfred Hospital. She is to be buried for the interment.

Lawrence Chapman, 22, Derby Street, Brunswick, is in the charge of the Royal Melbourne Hospital with a fractured skull and fractured neck. He suffered collision with a car near Brunswick on Saturday. A daughter, Miss Jessie Chapman, 22, suffered concussion and a fractured arm. She was admitted to Royal Melbourne Hospital.

James Frankell, 30, retired engine driver of Melbourne Bush Franklin, was admitted to Alfred Hospital in a critical condition with a fractured heart. He was about the same age as his son, George.
