

Man Killed at a Quarry.

CRUSHED BY FALLING METAL.

While working at the St. Albans quarries, St. Albans, yesterday, Charles Heyward, 47 years, Wales-street, West Footscray, was killed by being crushed by falling road metal. Joseph Bath, another employe at the quarries, stated that Heyward was standing on the top of a box levelling metal topping, which was about to be loaded into a truck. He told Heyward to get off the box, as he was about to release the clutch to transfer the load of metal to the truck. He saw He. and step clear, and he carried out the operation, but as the avalanche of metal came through the opening he was astounded to see the man's legs protruding. Heyward was taken from the box, and a doctor hastily summoned, but the unfortunate man was found to be dead. The body was removed to the City Morgue.
