MOTOR BUS ACCIDENT

Driver Garrett Injured

On Tuesday evening the motor bus which plies between Sunshine and Footscray sustained an accident, the third in the brief history of the service. The occurrence took place at the corner of Hampshire road. The car itself did not capsize, but the driver was thrown out and seriously jured. While Garrett, who owns the motor bus, was turning into Devonshire road, at the corner of Hampshire road, a motor-cycle coming from a different direction collided with the car. Garrett apparently sought to avoid a collision, but by some means he was thrown out, when the cycle collided again with the car and by some mischance ran over him. The car in the meantime mounted over two or three large concrete pipes lying in the gutter near the Savings Bank, and finished up on the footpath close to the bank. The incident occurred about eight o'clock in the evening. Garratt when thrown out of the car sustained injuries, both his arms and legs being dislocated, besides his face and body lacerated in a painful manner. He was conveyed to Mrs Aird's coffee palace close by, and remained

there during the night, as removal by ambulance would be too painful.
