BOY KILLED IN CAR COLLISION

6 Persons Injured

A boy was killed and 6 persons were injured when a taxi and a car collided at the intersection of Dorcas and Ferrars sts. South Melbourne, about 4.30pm yesterday.

Eric Tribe, 9, of Ballarat rd, Maldstone, who was a passenger in the car, driven by his father, Mr Sidney Charles Tribe, was killed instantly.

Mrs May Victoria Tribe, 35, the boy's mother, suffered a compound fracture of the left arm; Patricia Tribe, 13, suffered a fractured collar-bone; Mrs Nina Godley, 74, of Hawthorn rd, North Caulfield, admitted to Alfred Hospital with probable fracture of the pelvis; Mrs Dorothy Boyd, 19, of Alicia st, Hampton, lacerated head and abrasions; and her son, Garry Boyd, 3 months, shock. Mrs Tribe was admitted to Prince Henry's Hospital, where others were treated and detained for observation.

Charles Leahy, driver of the taxi, suffered broken ribs, but did not go to hospital. Mr Tribe was unhurt. The women and children were passengers in the car, which was returning from a party at the beach.
