

MAN KILLED AT KEILOR

WEEK-END ROAD ACCIDENTS

While Francis Goudie O'Neil, aged 36 years, married, of Keilor, was descending Spring Gully hill on the Calder Highway near Keilor, on Saturday afternoon, his bicycle got out of control and crashed into a motor-truck. O'Neil's head struck the handle of the door of the truck and he was killed almost instantly.

The police believe that a parcel which he had on the carrier interfered with a wire controlling the brake.

Glen Iris Boy Injured

Geoffrey Woolnough, aged 12 years, of Glen Iris road, Glen Iris, was admitted to the Alfred Hospital on Saturday morning with head injuries. He had been riding on a butcher's delivery cart which collided with a motor-truck at the corner of Dent street and Albion road, Glen Iris. The motor-truck was laden with bricks.

Struck by Tram

Struck by a tram at the corner of Dandenong road and Williams road, St. Kilda, last night, Eileen Arrowsmith, aged 65 years, of Banjo avenue, East Prahran, was taken in an ambulance to the Alfred Hospital. She was admitted with concussion, shock, and abrasions.

Pillion Rider Injured

While riding on the pillion of a motor-cycle which collided with a motor-car in Cheltenham yesterday evening, Esther Poplestone, aged 15 years, of Orlando street, Hampton, suffered a compound fracture of the leg. She was admitted to the Alfred Hospital.

Died From Injuries

SWAN HILL, Sunday.—While walking along the road at Woornmen last night, Norman August Jubb, aged 23 years, of Old Violet street, Bendigo, was knocked down by a motor-car. He received injuries from which he died later in the Swan Hill District Hospital.

Eight Persons Injured

HOBART, Sunday—Eight persons, including six children, were injured, two seriously, when a utility truck driven by Charles George Philip Fehre, aged 65 years, of Brown's River road, overturned on a road leading to Seven Mile Beach, about 14 miles from Hobart yesterday. The truck was being driven at about 35 miles an hour when it struck loose gravel and dashed across the road out of control. Alec Williams, aged five years, and Charles Fehre, aged eight years, were injured seriously.

Other Mishaps

Two men were injured in falls from motor-buses on Saturday night. John Rowden, aged 37 years, of King street, city, who fell from a tramway bus at the corner of Barkly and Gordon streets, Footscray, was admitted to the Royal Melbourne Hospital with fractured ribs, a lacerated lung, and shock. Thomas Slock, aged 63 years, of Queen street, St. Kilda, fractured his ankle when he fell from a bus in Inkerman street, St. Kilda. He was admitted to the Alfred Hospital.

When two motor-trucks collided on the Western Highway, near Deer Park, on Saturday night, Bernard Parker, aged 21 years, of Caroline street, Auburn, suffered a compound fracture of the lower arm and dislocation of the elbow. He was admitted to the Royal Melbourne Hospital.

A collision between a motor-cycle and a horse on the road from Narre Warren to Cranbourne resulted in a man and a woman being taken to the Alfred Hospital early yesterday morning. John Douglas, aged 27 years, of Narre Warren, the rider of the machine, was treated for lacerations to the scalp. Margaret Rogers, aged 27 years, of Latrobe street, East Brunswick, who was riding on the pillion seat, was treated for abrasions to the legs and lacerations to the scalp.

Injured when his car came into collision with a tram in Patterson street, Middle Park, late on Saturday night, H. Wilkins, of Bay street, Port Melbourne, was treated at the Alfred Hospital for a lacerated forehead. A passenger, Lorna Mead, aged 23 years, of Abbotsford street, Abbotsford, was treated for lacerations to the face.

Firemen from the Sandringham fire station, who were answering a call to a grass fire, were involved in a collision with a motor-cycle ridden by Jack Whitmore, aged 29 years, of Doveton avenue, Dandenong, at the corner of Sandringham road and Nelson street, Sandringham, yesterday afternoon. Whitmore was admitted to the Alfred Hospital with a dislocation of the elbow and fractures of the arm and the shoulder.

GEELONG, Sunday.—Anthony M. Kearney, aged 32 years, of Ryrie street, East Geelong, suffered extensive lacerations to the face and throat from flying glass when a motor-car in which he was a passenger collided with an electric tram standard near the Barwon bridge to-night.

YALLOURN, Sunday.—Ronald Gill, of Chelsea road, Chelsea, was admitted to the Yalourn Hospital on Saturday night in a critical condition suffering from a compound fracture of the skull and severe leg injuries. When riding a motor-cycle near the power station Gill collided with a motor-car.
