Mr. J. McCarney Killed

A well known resident of Sunshine, in the person of Mr John Gerald McCarney, of Ridley Street, was knocked down by a motor car near White City on Saturday night and died before medical aid could be summoned.

The driver of the car was Vincent Lionel Arthur, of Hamworth Street, Collingwood, who told the police that McCarney, apparently dazzled by the headlights of approaching cars, ran in front of his car.

Deceased, who was a returned soldier, was the son of the late John and Mary McCarney, and brother of Edward, Alice (Mrs Plazza) and Rupert. He was 40 years of age. The funeral, which took place to the Footscray cemetery on Monday last, was well attended. The Rev. Father Carney read the burial service.
