MOTOR ACCIDENTS ON BALLARAT ROAD.

Florence Temple, 40. Mrs. Court Hotel. Temple Queen street, City, received such severe head injuries that she died on the way to the hospital on Sunday afternoon when a motor car skidded on the Ballarat road, at Rockbank, near Cockbill's property, and overturned as the result of the blowing-out of a back tyre. Mrs. Temple fell under the car, the glass of the windscreen severely broken gashing her head and face on the right side. With her in the car were five other occupants: Mrs. Margaret O'Connor, Albion Hotel, Northcote; D. J. O'Connor, same address; Marle Henry, same address; Reginald Temple, licensee of the Temple Court Hotel, and another. all of whom were thrown out, but escaped with cuts and abrasions. The party were going to Ballan, and are said to have been travelling at a rate of 30 uniles per hour.

Collision near Lynch's Corner.

Two cars were, slightly damaged in a collision which occurred on Saturday afternoon near Lynch's corner. Henry Charles Dyte. a Thornbury chemist. accompanied by hert J. Price, also a chemist, was driving a sedan car westerly along Ballarat road when an unknown car turned westerly from Hampshire road into Ballarat road. Mr. Dyte swerved out to avoid the turning car only to be met by another coming easterly and driven by Alfred William Warren, Ballan, who had two passengers, R. A. Gould and John Noury. Neither driver had seen the other owing to the unknown car obsenting the view National Library of Australia

car obscuring the view. Both applied their brakes and the cars come together with sufficient force to damage them slightly. None of the occupants were injured.
