

FATALITY AT BROOKLYN.

While working at Angliss's Imperial Quarries at Brooklyn, on Monday afternoon Timothy Reardon met with an accident which resulted in his death, and his many friends were deeply grieved. Reardon a quarryman 45 years of age, and a man of genial disposition was a married man and resided at Errol street, West Footscray. With two other men he was working at the bottom of the quarry while a charge of rack-a-rock was being prepared on a higher level. The men continued work after the charge had been placed, and were about to move away when an explosion occurred, moments before it was expected and about 75 tons of stone came tumbling down the side of the quarry towards them. Reardon's companions luckily escaped injury, but he was struck by a huge boulder which tore a leg off his body and then rolled upon him. Death must have been instantaneous. The body was taken to the Morgue by Constable Ross.
