Two Hurt at Warburton

Mr. Lawrence Chapman, 31 years, Derby-road, Sunshine, and Miss Nellie Gale, 23, Midley-street, Sunshine, suffered head injuries in a collision between their motor cycle and a car on the Cement Creek-road, about three miles from Warburton, late yesterday afternoon. They were rounding a sharp bend when the mishap occurred. The impact threw them about 30 feet. After first-aid treatment at the Hydro Hospital, Warburton, they were brought by civil ambulance to Melbourne and admitted to Royal Melbourne Hospital. Mr. Chapman sustained a fractured skull and lacerated scalp. Miss Gale concussion and a lacerated scalp.

TWO DEAD IN CYCLE ACCIDENT

4 Week-end Deaths

Two men were killed at 1 a.m. today, when a motor cycle ran head-on into a car in Warrigal Road, near Keys Road, Moorabbin.

John Sadlington, 30, of Bayview Street, Princes, who was believed to be driving the motor cycle and Stanley James Watson, 28, an ice worker, of Krol Street, Princes, were the victims.

Two others were killed and two seriously injured in week-end road accidents, and another man collapsed at the wheel of his car.

George T. Bateman, 72, retired farmer of Hastings, was struck by a car as he stepped from a car on to the main road, a short distance from the township early on Sunday morning.

On Saturday night he had started out with friends to see his daughter, Mrs. Mervell, arrive in the Hecker Street. He died an hour after he was admitted to the Hastings Hospital.

Ray Anderson, 37, Church of England Hostel, Clifton Street, Richmond, while riding a bicycle collided with a car in the Boulevard, South Yarra.

Mr. Freeman Edwards, 73, Dornie Road, Dornie, collapsed and died while driving his car in Surrey Hills on Saturday night. The car crashed into a light standard and Annie Edwards, 70, his wife, was admitted to Alfred Hospital. She is to be treated for leg injuries.

Lawrence Chapman, 22, Dorset Road, Burdette, is on the charge list at Royal Melbourne Hospital, with a fractured skull and fractured ribs. His motor cycle collided with a car near Warrigal on Sunday. A passenger, Miss Paula Cole, 22, suffered contusions and a fractured skull. She was admitted to Royal Melbourne Hospital.

James Crookell, 70, retired school teacher of Melbourne Road, Frankston, was admitted to Alfred Hospital in a critical condition with a fractured head. He was struck by a car near his home on Sunday.
