Outside the gate of No. 5 Explosive Factory, Ballarat Road, Deer Park, at 7.15 a.m. on Monday last, two motor cycles met in a head-on collison. One manwas killed and two others seriously injured. The killed was William Livingstone Ingram, 31 years of Duke Street, Sunshine, who was a married man with two children. The injured, who were admitted to the Melbourne Hospital, were Albert Eric Stanyer, Dedrick Grove, Sunshine, and Albert George Carter, of Yewers Street, Sunshine. The former has a fractured pelvis, internal injuries and broken leg, whilst Carter has a fractured skull, broken kneecap and arm. Both are in a serious condition.
