The parents told police that Brian was asleep on a seat with a blanket around him when the train stopped at Goulburn, which is only a few miles from Breadalbane. They dozed off, and when they awakened Brian was missing. The parents and railway officials searched the train without success. success.

Police believe that the boy, befuddled with sleep, left his comparament to go to the washroom, opened a carriage door by mistake and fell to the railway line.

They think that he was not seriously injured by the fall but wandered along the track in a dazed condition and was struck by a fruit train which was about 20 minutes behind the Albury mail.

The driver of the fruit train reported to police that he felt a bump a short distance from Breadalbane.

The Wilkes family arrived as migrants from England about three years ago.

While anxious parents combed express. v dead

ARENTS of a Sunshine (Victoria) family off to Queensland for a holiday anxiously searched the Albury-Sydney mail train early yesterday morning for their son, 13.

But he lay dead on the railway line miles back near Breadalbane, 150 miles from Sydney.

Police believe the boy, Brian Wilkes, left his compartment about 2 a.m. to go to the tollet,

They think he opened a carriage door by mistake and fell out of the

Then, dazed and injured, the boy probably scrambled back on to the line and was, police believe, struck by the engine of a fruit train 20 minutes behind the express.

The driver of the fruit train reported that he had felt a bump.

Mr. and Mrs. Wilkes, of Hotham st., Sunshine, searched the train thinking their son had wandered off to some other section.

Brian's two sisters brother were in the family party.
