Police said heavy rain was falling at the time and they believed Jackson, the driver. could not see the train.

Wedged under

The train hit the utility while travelling about 60 miles an hour and careered 243 yards down the line with the truck wedged under its wheels.

A huge railway breakdown crane and a Commonwealth truck crane took more than the three hours to free wreckage tangled under the train's bogey.
