

Sad Drowning Fatality

On Saturday last, another drowning fatality occurred in the Sunshine Swimming Pool, when Walter Stirling Hyett was drowned.

The lad was bathing with some companions, when they left to swim in adjoining pool. When they returned they could not find Hyett.

A polo match being on at the time at the other end, no one noticed Hyett in trouble.

Mr. Cyril Stedman dived for him but he was unsuccessful owing to the nature of the water and the depth.

The police were notified and after dragging with grappling irons for two and a half hours recovered the body at 7 p.m.

Deceased was the only child of Mr and Mrs. J. Hyett, corner Sydney Street and King Edward Avenue, Sunshine, to whom deepest sympathy is tendered.

The funeral which was largely attended took place on Monday afternoon from Sunshine to the Footscray Cemetery. A large number of school children marched in front of the hearse and there was a large collection of beautiful floral tributes among which were some magnificent wreaths from the Sunshine Swimming Club, Albion Mothers' Club, Scholars and teachers of Albion State School and the Sunshine Boy Scouts.
