

## KEILOR BUS ACCIDENT.

### Driver's Injuries Prove Fatal.

John Duffy, 35 years, mechanic, of Fletcher-street, Castlemaine, who was the driver of the motor bus which got out of control and overturned on Curly Hill, Keilor, on Monday night, succumbed to his injuries in St. Vincent's Hospital at 5.30 p.m. yesterday. Alexander Salomy, 56 years, watch maker, of Moxon-street, Castlemaine, is an inmate of the same hospital. He sustained head injuries, a lacerated face and an injury to the leg. His condition is reported to be serious. Mrs. Wedeeha Salomy, wife of Alexander Salomy, and Ivy Todd, of Flagg's Hotel, Campbell's Creek, were admitted to Royal Melbourne Hospital. Mrs. Salomy is suffering from a compound fracture of the leg, and Ivy Todd, from a compound fracture of the leg and shock. Late yesterday afternoon their condition was reported to have improved.

Mrs. Nellie Scott, 46 years, of Fletcher-street, Castlemaine, received an injured leg, shock and abrasions. She was admitted to St. Vincent's Hospital, and is progressing favorably. Another passenger, Mrs. Hogarth, escaped injury.
